### **THE HARLEM RENAISSANCE**

The Harlem Renaissance came to an end during the Great Depression mostly because the African American community counted on wealthy white patrons (who were hurt by the recession) to contribute to the success of their shows Nevertheless, the movement inspired new authors, musicians and black intellectuals during the civil rights movement
